

Preparation of a Five-Year Master Plan for Albuquerque Technical-Vocational Institute's Main Campus, Albuquerque, NM

Architectural Research Consultants, Incorporated (ARC), working with Cherry/See Architects, developed a five-year master plan to identify and guide capital improvements on the main campus of the Albuquerque Technical-Vocational Institute (T-VI). The planning goals were to:

- Develop a vision for future physical development
- Develop a comprehensive assessment of the main campus site and facilities
- Identify required capital improvements
- Prepare Chapter X of the five-year institutional plan that is required by the New Mexico Commission on Higher Education

In summary, the planning process found:

- The main campus evolved into three distinct sub-areas as T-VI responded to explosive enrollment growth. This growth has increased issues with identity, functional relationships, access for pedestrians, vehicles and parking.
- T-VI's facilities are in reasonably good physical condition, but there are major site and building issues associated with improving student "quality of life" and complying with ADA.
- The campus is near its capacity to reasonably accommodate all existing programs and associated support, access and parking requirements. Future development required strategic decisions regarding future programmatic and physical growth.
