

Feasibility Study, Jemez Mountain Trail, Sandoval County, New Mexico

The Jemez Mountain Trail was designated a Scenic and Historic Byway in 1994 by the state of New Mexico, and is comprised of NM 4 from San Ysidro to the Los Alamos County line, NM 44 from San Ysidro to Cuba, and NM 126 from Cuba to La Cueva. Architectural Research Consultants, Incorporated (ARC) was retained by the Sandoval County Tourism Department to identify feasible projects which will most benefit the Jemez Mountain Trail region by providing additional amenities for residents and trail users. ARC's scope including the following:

- Inventory existing trail facilities and resources including assessing condition and appropriateness from additional development in support of the Trail.
- Interviews/focus group with community leaders and concerned citizens
- Survey trail users were to gather comments on various recreation sites and facility needs.
- Identify proposed projects.
- Identify potential sources of funding.
- Prepare design guidelines for consideration during future phases of the project.
