

# Facilities Master Plan 2006-2010 - Update for 2008

## Los Lunas Public Schools, Los Lunas, NM



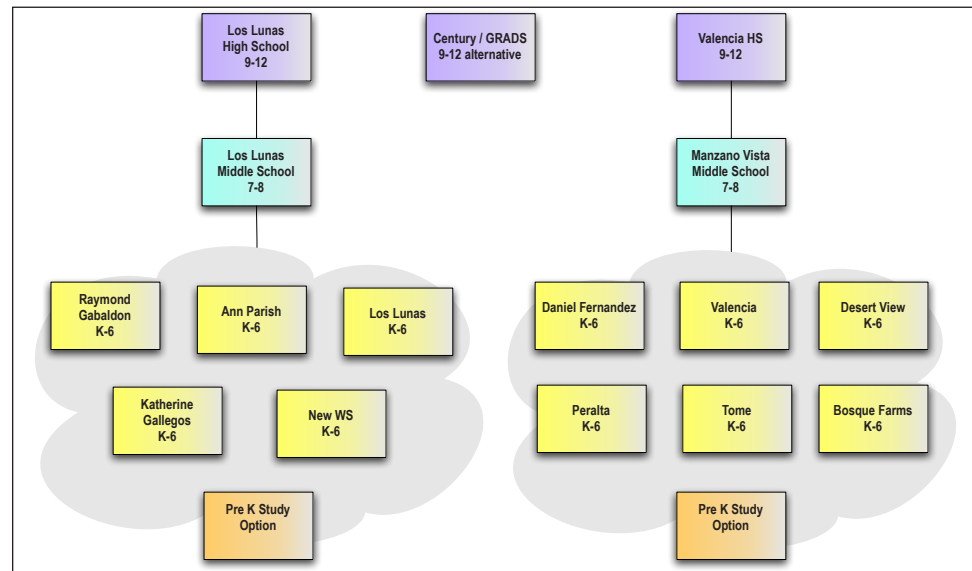
Architectural Research Consultants, Incorporated (ARC) contracted with Los Lunas Public Schools in Los Lunas, New Mexico, to update the district's comprehensive Facilities Master Plan (FMP). ARC researched the economic and demographic changes since the 2006 study and documented the district's progress in its capital improvements program. The project did not include any follow-up facility evaluation.

The study did not change the 2006 listed capital needs of \$173.1 million identified in the previous study for identified condition and programmatic needs.

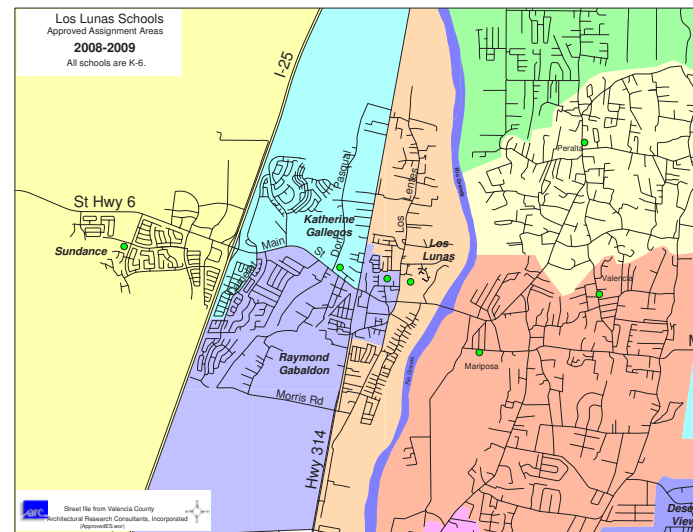
The district is in its second year of changing boundaries to allow for grade level changes in its elementary schools. The School Board approved a boundary change strategy in February 2006 which created a pure feeder school system with two high schools, two middle schools and 10 elementary (K-6) schools. The district's transition to K-6 schools is planned from 2006-2010. During this transition, renovations at some schools, such as Desert View Elementary, can accommodate the shifting need for classrooms. Some schools, such as Tomé and Valencia, will need building expansion in the long term. The plan update documents how the K-6 transition is progressing after two years, noting evolving space issues at Katherine Gallegos, Bosque Farms and Peralta.
